



## **Updates on Registry Enrollment and Growth of the Care Center Network**

Dr. Timothy Whelan: Hi, I'm here with PILOT in Nashville at the PFF Summit. This morning we had some great sessions talking about how to maximize available therapies for IPF. One of the most exciting things that was discussed this morning was how the Pulmonary Fibrosis Foundation is doing with their registry. It's really been a success. Over a short period of time, we're actually enrolling more patients in the registry than anticipated. We're up to about nearly 1400 patients thus far.

This is a great opportunity for us to really learn about the natural history of idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis. Also, even more exciting news was revealed, that they're going to increase the Care Center Network. They're going to go from 41 sites to adding more sites so that the Care Center Network is more available to patients all throughout the United States. The biggest thing for physicians who are out there that may be interested is that they're going to be looking for applications in January of 2018. In addition, for physicians that are interested in doing more for actual research with that registry, you can submit your research ideas. All of this information you can find at the PFF's website.
